#### Modifications for Special Education/504

Students with special needs: The students' needs will be addressed on an individual and grade level using a variety of modalities. Accommodations will be made for those students who need extra time to complete assignment. Support staff will be available to aid students related to IEP specifications. 504 accommodations will also be attended to by all instructional leaders. Physical expectations and modifications, alternative assessments, and scaffolding strategies will be used to support this learning. The use of Universal Design for Learning (UDL) will be considered for all students as teaching strategies are considered. Additional safety precautions will be made along with additional staff so all student can fully participate in the standards associated with this Art Curriculum.

- Provide extended time for written responses and reports.
- Create a word wall with cultural Art names/vocabulary.
- Leveled texts for analyzing primary and secondary sources

#### **Modifications for At-Risk Students**

Formative and summative data will be used to monitor student success. At first signs of failure, student work will be reviewed to determine support. This may include parent consultation, basic skills review and differentiation strategies. With considerations to UDL, time may be a factor in overcoming developmental considerations. More time will be made available with a certified instructor to aid students in reaching the standards.

- Provide an outline for journal entries and research tasks.
- Provide extended time for written responses and reports.
- Encourage student choice of topics / genres.

The following can be utilized: Review previously learned art terminology. Include terms for human emotions. Students will use their artwork to express a series of emotions. Give a secret cue card to each student with an emotion written on it. Use a variety of cues from strong to subtle, e.g., fear or shyness. Instruct students to mime their word and have the class guess the emotion. When expressed, write the name of the emotion on the board. Write a brief scene on the board. Students in pairs will create art display to relate the emotions created by the scene.  • Display labeled images of a rt movements.  • Use artwork to respond to theme / emotion in sound  • Display artwork.  • Assign an art partner.	Students excelling in mastery of standards will be challenged with complex, high level challenges related to the complexity of the Art requirements. This will include allowing more opportunities to demonstrate creativity and the design of original artwork. In addition, the following can be utilized:  • Alternate Learning Activities/Units: Opportunities to pursue alternate activities permit students to engage in new learning and avoid the boredom of repeating instruction or unnecessary practice in skills already mastered.  • Create an original artwork based on the cultural themes and art elements from related historical art movements.  • Compare and contrast historical/ cultural art from different time periods and geographic regions.  • Become an expert on one medium/ style and teach the history, influence, and performance of this style to peers.
