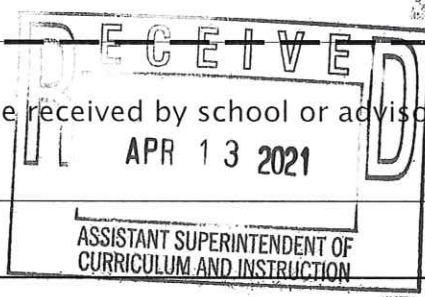

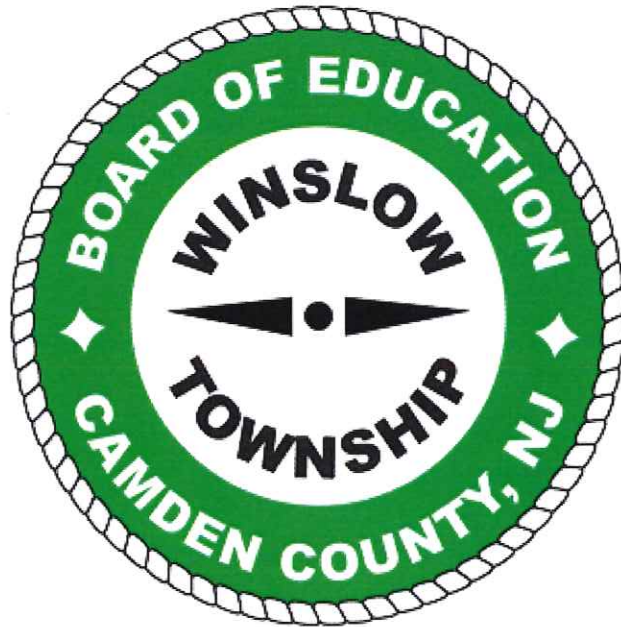

March 1, 2021, brought the beginning of our hybrid schedule at long last! Students finally entered our halls and showed themselves to be the true superheroes of the year! They were so excited to return and we were just as excited to have them back at least in part, some semblance of normalcy.

**Sustainable Jersey**

On March 19, 2021, Winslow Township Elementary School #4 was awarded a grant in the amount of \$10,000. The funds we received will allow us to add onto the first phase of a Fitness Trail for our students, staff and community. We were able to create signs that will mark our trail route and provide fitness stations along the way. 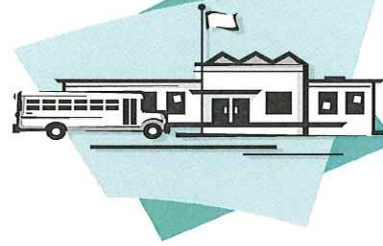
**On March 12<sup>th</sup>, interim reports were made available for parents/guardians to see their students' progress.**

## AP Exams

AP exams are scheduled to begin on May 18th. Payment for AP exams is being collected until May 10, 2021. All payments must be delivered, with the registration form, to Mrs. Norlin via the Main Office. Exams are \$86.00 per exam. Free/reduced lunch rate is \$53.00 per exam. Free/reduced lunch rate MUST be verified by AP Coordinator prior to payment. Payment must be made in exact amount and will be returned if incorrect. The College Board is providing multiple options for the format of this year's AP exam administration. This includes a traditional "paper & pencil" style test and an online "digital" version.



### Key Points to Note:

- In order to accommodate student and family COVID-19 safety needs, Winslow Twp. HS will be administering a digital version of the exam except for Physics II and Spanish. These students will be notified and will have to test in school.
- Students registering for the digital version of the exam will test at home. Students should not report to school for a digital exam.
- Please note that iPads CAN NOT be used for this year's digital exams.
- Students must use a desktop, laptop or Chromebook. If you do not have a Chromebook, please let the AP Coordinator know.

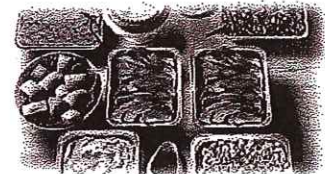
## Fire & Ice
