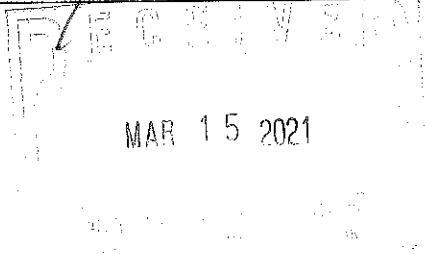

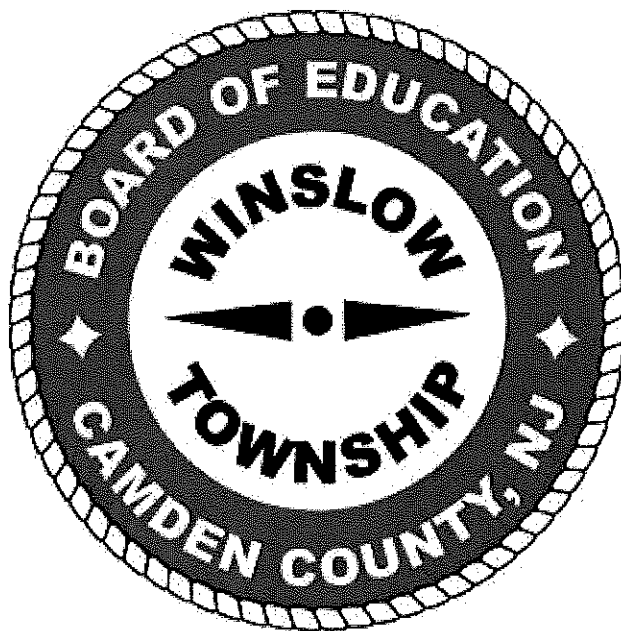

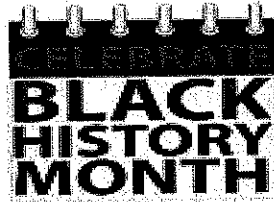

Parent/Teacher conferences-February 10th and 11th

Black History month presentations-during the month of February preschool through 3rd grade students created essays, projects, crafts, and did research on famous African Americans during the month of February. A schoolwide collaborative video was created and uploaded on the School One website.

Welcome back students-Welcome back letter sent home on February 18th to parent and families for students returning for hybrid instruction returned to school on March 1st.

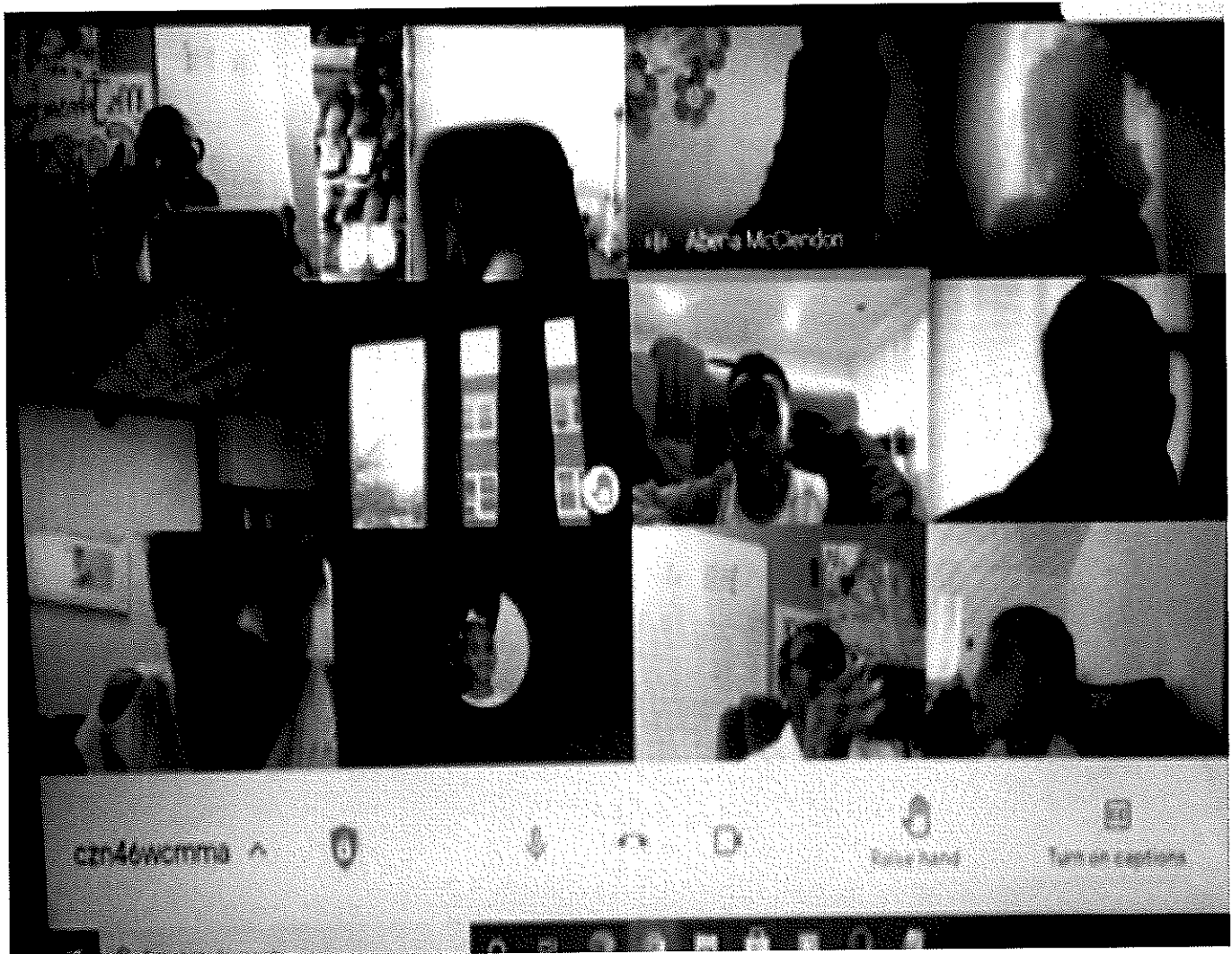

Black History Month

Winslow School #4 students were immersed in learning about Black History during the month of February. Different grade levels provided different experiences, and the following is a glimpse at some of the things that were done in recognition of Black History Month.

Pre K

Preschool teachers had daily conversations with their students about Black History Month, and created a theme on transportation with an in-depth look at the traffic light, which was created by Garret Morgan.

Throughout the theme the teachers also focused on the colors, circles, listening comprehension, gross motor skills with "stop" and "go".

Kindergarten

- K-teachers created school wide videos
- Bitmoji classroom page to display new Black History videos
- Bitmoji classroom page with previously taught Black History videos displayed
- Daily Black History videos and resources on opening K-Bitmoji page
- Writing- teacher modeling of how to write and create a book about famous Black Americans.
- Reading - teacher created read aloud assignment with multiple Black American stories - students listened and responded by sharing their favorite part or detail.
- Morning Meeting discussions, read alouds and activities focused on famous Black Americans in history.
- Social Studies learning videos for students to visit in the Learning Zone about famous Black Americans.
- Students recorded video responses of thoughts and details after listening to read alouds.

First Grade

- Created a Bitmoji classroom with a post for each day of the month that highlighted an important figure in Black History
- Created a Google page of grade level appropriate literature and biographies that was themed with figures that are important in Black History.

Second Grade

For Black History Month, second grade created one asynchronous lesson a day during social studies. Week 1 was an introduction and STEAM leaders. Week 2 finished STEAM and began with athletes. Weeks 3 and 4 will finish athletes and move to Civil Rights leaders. Black History Month is also addressed in our reading anthology. Teachers also assigned guided reading books that celebrate black leaders and history. Teachers facilitated conversations about the social studies lessons and books to check for understanding. Students completed a report on an inspirational figure in Black History as a culmination of the month's learning.

Third Grade

The third grade team at Winslow Township School #4 used several different platforms and activities to celebrate Black History Month in 2021. Students in third grade learned about many noteworthy individuals, both past and present, and celebrated their contributions to our society and the world. Using Google slideshows, interactive videos, Achieve 3000 articles, and hands-on activities, teachers incorporated lessons into many different subject areas including Social Studies, Science, Language Arts, and Mathematics. Culminating activities produced meaningful conversations and incredible pieces of art such as illustrations of the famous lyrics of Louis Armstrong and step-by-step portraits of Amanda Gorman.

Special Areas

In Computers students learned about various important figures in Black History by way of an introductory lesson in Google slides, also learning how to cut, paste, add an image, resize, and move images.

In Physical Education, students were able to explore important athletic figures in Black History and then participate in exercises that went along with the sport that was highlighted by the athlete.

In Music, students explored famous figures such as Stevie Wonder, Duke Ellington, Ella Fitzgerald, and Alvin Ailey. Students also explored famous tap dancers and learned the basics of how to tap dance. Additionally, students learned the beginning of the Black National Anthem.

In Art, students studied Alma Thomas, who was a painter who moved from Georgia to Washington DC to escape the South. She became the first Black woman to earn a Bachelor's degree in art and to have a solo show at the Whitney Museum in DC.

School Wide

As a school wide activity, Winslow Township School #4 staff and one Board member participated in creating video presentations of important figures in Black History. A Google Sheet link was created so that the entire school had access to all of the created lessons and were able to post and/or share them with students asynchronously. We felt that this was a great way for our students to experience a variety of presentations and learn about many significant people.

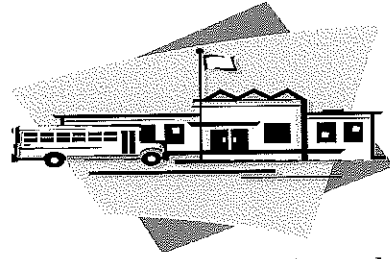
Parent/Teacher Conferences were held February 10th-11th.
