On April 21st, report cards were made available for parents/guardians to see their students' progress.

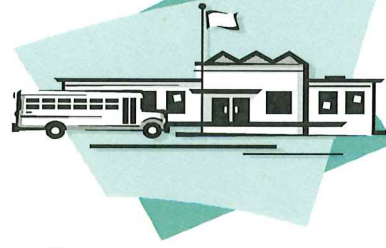

- **Cadet SGT Jade Watford-Lamar** is working with her mother by donating her time to the program "The Unforgotten Haven."

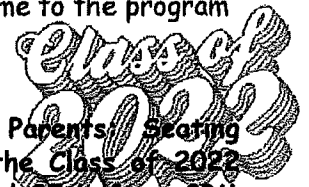

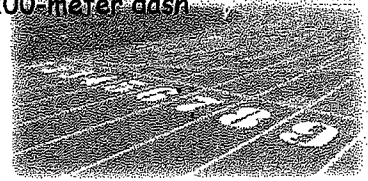
