**Week of Respect**

During the week of October 4th through the 8th, School 4 participated in the statewide "Week of Respect". This week is a part of the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights that became effective September 1, 2011. During this week, Mrs. Duca, our school counselor, teaches classroom lessons based on different character education and anti-bullying themes:

**Pre-School**

Pre-school students read It's Okay to be Different by Todd Parr. The theme of this lesson was to be kind to each other despite any differences/disabilities. After reading the story together, the children discussed what makes them special. They then drew a self-portrait, emphasizing all of their unique traits.

**Kindergarten**

Kindergarten read the book Jungle Bullies by Steven Kroll. This book uses jungle animals to teach a lesson about bullying. To get what they want, the larger jungle animals bully the smaller ones until Mama Monkey shows them all the benefits of sharing. Students then colored a picture that shows sharing, and also sequenced the events from the story.

**1st Grade**

First grade students reading Stand Tall, Molly Lou Melon by Patty Lovell. This book emphasizes the theme that we should be the best person we can be, believe in ourselves, and always be proud of who we are. First grade students were then asked to complete a sentence and drawing to tell what makes them "stand tall" like Molly Lou.

**2nd Grade**

Second grade students watched a video called "Kindness Boomerang". This short video depicts the ripple-effect of kind acts -- the way in which receiving an unexpected moment of generosity from a stranger can cause us to become more aware of the needs of those around us and to take action to become a vector of goodness. Each kind act from the video was discussed and the effect it had on the mood of the person who was the recipient of the kind act and the person performing it. Students then set a kindness goal for themselves for the year and completed a Kindness Rating Scale. This helped them see which areas they could try and improve on when it comes to kindness (i.e. "I share willingly"; "I make others feel welcome").

**3rd Grade**

Third grade students read The Invisible Boy by Trudy Ludwig which is a story about a boy who feels invisible because he is always ignored and left out. It takes a new student that recognizes his special talent for art and makes him feel included. As the story goes on, and the boy feels more noticed, the illustrations show him becoming "visible" again. We then discussed how a few kind words could change someone's day. Each student was asked to pick a kind word(s) to draw on their own "Building Block of Kindness".

## Red Ribbon Week

School #4 students participated in Red Ribbon Week during October 25, 2021 - October 29, 2021. Our school focus was on violence prevention awareness and promoting positive character. The students were encouraged to participate in themed days during the week to reinforce the message.

The themes were as follows:

Monday, October 25, 2021

Sock it to bullies! - Wear your most colorful socks.

Tuesday, October 26, 2021

Put a cap on bullying! - Wear your favorite hat.

Wednesday, October 27, 2021

Bullying is hair raising! - Show off your wildest hairstyle.

Thursday, October 28, 2021

Recognize the HERO in yourself! - Help Everyone Respect Others by wearing a superhero shirt.

Friday, October 29, 2021

Words are knowledge! - Students wore their Vocabulary Parade costume.

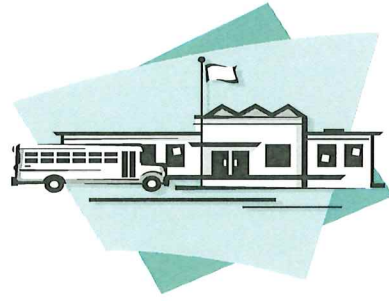

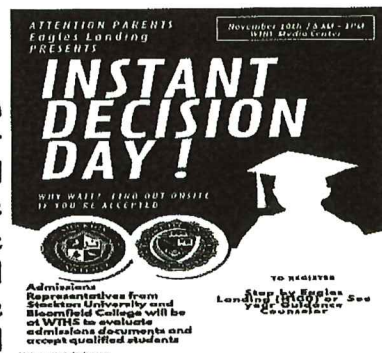

## Instant Decision Day!

On November 10, 2021, admissions representatives from Stockton University and Bloomfield College will be on campus at WTHS to evaluate admissions documents and accept qualified students. One of the most excruciating aspects of the college admissions process is the long wait. Students with ambition to pursue higher education submit applications in November or December and often times wait four to five months to receive a reply. The uncertainty about future plans often makes this period very stressful for parents and students. But for some college applicants there is an easier alternative. That alternative is an Instant Decision Day. An Instant Decision Day is an opportunity for high school students to reduce the entire admissions process (including, in some cases, financial or merit aid) to one day. Students will have the opportunity ask questions and receive clarity regarding the Stockton and Bloomfield experience. Eagles Landing and the Guidance Department will collaborate to help students prepare the essential documents to become accepted on-site. Students can stop by Eagles Landing (H100) to sign up. If accepted, students then have until National Decision Day, May 1st of their senior year, to accept or refuse the admissions offer.



## College and Career Week

As part of College and Career week, Camden County Workforce Development Board (CCWDB) visited WTHS on October 29th to present its Atlantic City Electric Career Path to Energy initiative. This initiative is an occupational skills training program designed to introduce and prepare southern New Jersey residents for career paths in the energy and utility industry. The CCWDB's primary aim is to understand the needs of those job seekers and employers who can benefit from their many resources such as career counseling, assessments, employer hiring recruitments, training opportunities, certifications in demand occupations, individual employment plans and job search support. 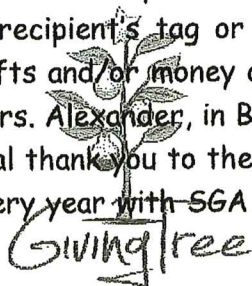
## '21-'22 School Year
