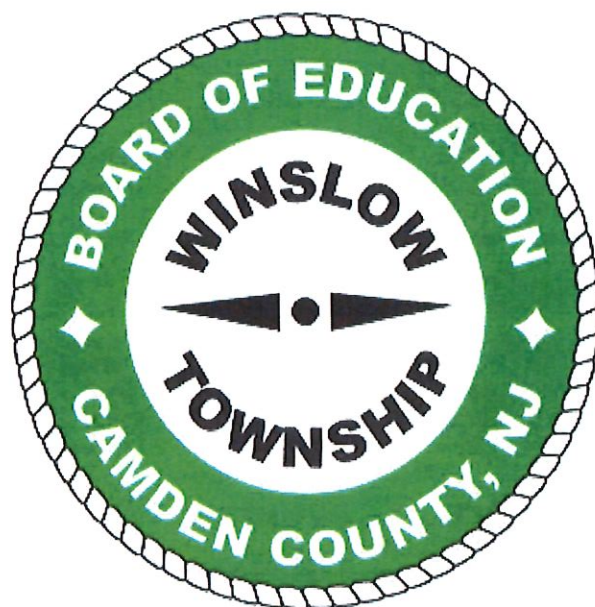

Honor Roll Students for the 1st marking period, December Student of the Month and Eagles of Excellence recipients were recognized with certificates.

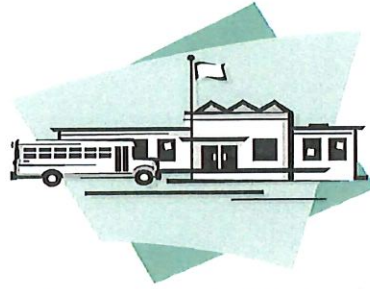

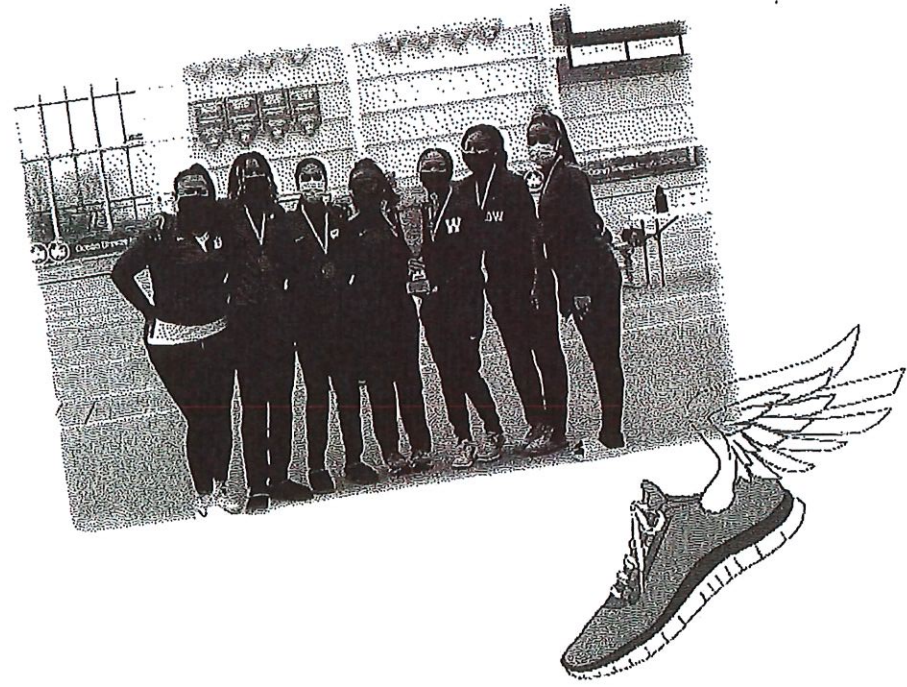
