

Black History Month

Winslow Township Elementary School #4 celebrated Black History during February with the following activities:

Pre K

Through the use of books and videos, preschool explored African American contributions throughout history. Preschoolers participated in weekly activities embedded into learning themes. They learned about figures such as Garrett A. Morgan, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Mae C. Jemison, former President Barack Obama, and more.

On February 28, 2022, Ms. Leslie Showell of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Incorporated joined us virtually to read the book Rhythm of My Feet by Rashid Moon to our Preschool students.

<u>Kindergarten</u>

Kindergarteners read various books by African American authors. They learned about an assortment of African Americans from history and their contributions to society. Famous African Americans such as Ruby Bridges, Harriet Tubman, George Washington Carver, Rosa Parks, Garrett A. Morgan, and others will be discussed.

First Grade

First graders listened to daily read alouds and/or watched daily videos to learn about the history of influential African Americans as well as discuss their significance. Students reflected on how these people have impacted their lives today. They also completed a weekly assignment in response to videos and read alouds to demonstrate their understanding of these influential people and their accomplishments.

Second Grade

For Black History Month, second grade students researched a historical African American figure, completed a research project, and portrayed the role of that historical figure during our Black History Month Living Wax Museum presentation on February 25, 2022.

Third Grade

Students in third grade researched a historical African American figure. Using their research, students wrote an informational paragraph about their designated person. Students then each designed a quilt square highlighting the person's portrait and their accomplishments. The completed squares were combined to create a collaborative quilt that was displayed in the hallway along with the informational paragraphs.

Special Areas

In Computers, students in 3rd grade learned how to use Google Slides to research important figures. They inserted images, copied and pasted important information for each person.

In Physical Education, students learned about accomplished African American Olympians. Each week students chose an athlete from the "Olympic Wall" to discuss their achievements and contributions to their individual sport.

In Music, students learned the African American Anthem, jazz greats such as Ella Fitzgerald, Louis Armstrong, Dizzy Gillespie, African American Ballerina Misty Copland, African American Tap dancers, especially Bill "Bo jangles" Robinson, Nicholas Brothers (tap), Savion Glover (modern tap), and Opera great Kathleen Battle. Students also wore taps on their shoes and tap danced to jazz music.

In Art, students studied a new African American artist every class. In the grade levels, Kindergarten students learned about the quilt artist Sanford Biggers and created their own quilt. Second grade students studied Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s "I Have a Dream..." speech to create kind-word quilts. Third Grade students read Amanda Gorman's poetry and created floral art inspired by her words.

In ESL, students watched a short video about a historical, African American figure each week during February. We had a class discussion about the person and how they had a part in changing the world.

Self-contained

Dean (LLD 2/3) - Using reading passages and videos, students explored famous African Americans of their choice. They will gather information and create a lap book.

Bruno/Messick (MD): Through books and videos they explored famous African American inventors. Students will also complete a home to school project, by recreating a model from one of the inventors.

Forbes (LLD (K/1) - Using fine motor skills, students helped to create an interactive bulletin board outside of the classroom, with a focus on 19 African American Leaders past and present. Each day during the month of February, students explored these figures' contributions to the world through videos and read-alouds. On the last day, students chose a figure that they most admired and created a visual-tactile to take home.

School Wide

As a school-wide activity, Winslow Township School #4 teachers created a display in the school lobby, so that students were greeted each day with the figure and bio of an important African American.


Leo Club


