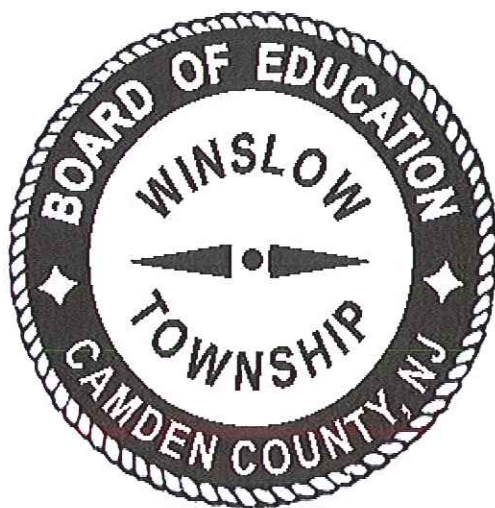

November 3rd-21st -Joe Corbi's Fundraiser-annual School One HSA fundraiser, with 10% of proceeds allotted to School One for school activities for students.

Nov. 14th-MAD Science assembly-science based assembly for students in kindergarten through third grades.

Nov. 4th-20th-Thanksgiving Food Drive-students donated food items for a local community church.

Nov. 19th-Faculty Meeting-grade level data team meetings.

During the month of November:

RTI-Response to Intervention-students receive daily RTI instruction in kindergarten through third grades, at their specific learning level from low struggling to advanced learners.

Shining Star Rewards-tickets awarded to students exemplifying positive behaviors, earning a weekly prize announced after an end of the day Name Drawing.

Word of the Day-third grade students announce higher level vocabulary writing and math words as part of the morning daily announcements. The words of the day and students names are displayed in the front foyer of the school building.

Artist of the Month-Each art class, first through third grades are awarded "Mona Lisa Art Buckaroo points for displaying "art studio" behavior expectations and following "art studio rules". Winners receive a certificate, their photo on the award wall and a choice of pencil or sketchbook.

I&RS-Intervention and Referral Services-I7RS meetings used to discuss and review student data and performance of students struggling behaviorally or academically.

The Perfecting Church Perfecting Chords Afterschool Music Program-Every Monday a local community church, The Perfecting Church, hosts a musical/instrumental

program after school for students, preschool through third grades, on site at School One.

Emergency /Safety Drill-regularly scheduled monthly emergency/safety drills conducted across the District to ensure the safety of all staff and students in the event of an actual emergency.

Parent/Principal meetings-Parent/Teacher/Principal meetings-meetings to discuss student discipline, classroom concerns, peer issues or conflicts, instructional needs and student data.

Principal's attendance at regularly scheduled Principals meetings.

Meetings with District ELA and Math Supervisors to determine the instructional needs of students in preschool through third grades, curriculum and instruction common core alignment and third grade student PARCC preparation.

Regular HSA meetings-monthly Home and School Association meetings to support communication between home, school and community, plan events and discuss upcoming School One activities.

ESD Tutoring-Extended School Day Tutoring-Afterschool tutoring provided for School One students, Monday through Thursday.

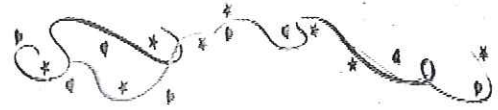
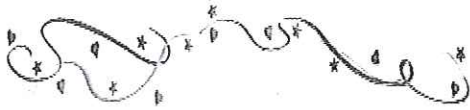

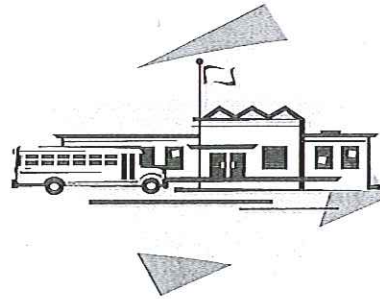

- The Home and School Association sponsored a Wawa Hoagie sale from November 17th through the 21st.

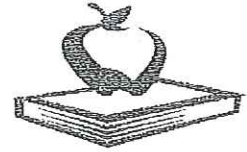
MIDDLE SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS

Students from both organizations will travel to the various school and lead the little ones in song and cheer as they celebrate the season with service and camaraderie.

A select group of WTHS students, engaged in the study of science and under the tutelage of Mrs. Karen Rivard, had the opportunity to visit the Cooper Hospital Trauma Center on Monday, November 10th, 2014. The focus of the day was to enlighten students as to what occurs in a busy trauma center. This particular field trip had a dual emphasis: effects of negative choices on the human body as a result of negative influences and choices and the knowledge and science behind the care of trauma victims. The day consisted of touring the trauma unit, viewing slides of trauma victims and visiting the ICU where patients were recuperating. It was an emotional and educational day for all.

On Friday, November 14th, 2014, a very energetic and curious group of Environmental Science students visited the Franklin Institute to tour the exhibit aptly entitled "Body Worlds: Animals Down Under." Nurse's Corner: Nurse Taylor recommends that all students and staff wear hats, gloves and scarves to protect the delicate parts of the bodies from the upcoming winter chill. Sleep, a healthy diet and fluids must be on the must-do list to stay healthy during winter. Two of the most common complaints among teenagers in the winter include cold sores and dry/ashy skin. 50-80% of Americans have herpes simplex virus type 1 which remains in the body and can cause an outbreak of blisters at any time. Cold sores can pop up when the body is tired, stressed or when you are not taking good care of yourself. It is not harmful, but they do sting and look funny. At the first sign of the "tingle," purchase a topical cream that helps healing. Apply frequently until cold sore disappears. Dry or ashy skin results from dry indoor heat, cold outdoor temperatures and low humidity, all of which can strip your skin of moisture. Limit showers to 10 minutes and use warm water instead of hot which makes the skin dry. While skin is damp, slather on body cream. Also try to use PH balanced soap, hand cream every time you wash your hands and a humidifier in the room. Keep your skin protected from the cold air as much as possible by using scarves and gloves.
