This awards program is designed to recognize high school students in the region who embody the university's commitment to develop and inspire leaders to affect positive change. The letter of notification sent to her read "The award signifies Widener University High School Leadership Awards Committee recognizes your ability to demonstrate courage by standing up for what is right, finding a way to address a wrong, or making a difference in a significant way." Chelsea is a daily testament to the recognition as an exemplary student, president of Key Club-a service organization, stunning actress and member of the Drama Club, historian in student government, newly elected member of The National Honor Society, vital member of the WTHS Community Outreach Team and forerunner of the upcoming student-forum on January 9<sup>th</sup>. Chelsea will be recognized at the National Constitution Center on March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2014. All award recipients will then convene at Widener's campus for an exciting, unique day of leadership training in the fall of 2014. Additionally, if Chelsea chooses to enroll at Widner upon graduation, she will receive a \$20,000 scholarship.

The annual College for a Day Trip to Camden County College will take place on January 16<sup>th</sup>, 2014. The purpose of this trip is to assist current high school seniors who plan to attend CCC in the fall. Students will complete the college application, take the placement test and tour the campus in one day! Camden County College admission counselors will return to Winslow Township High School in the spring and students will be able to register for fall classes and receive assistance with the financial aid process. A total of 80 seniors have already registered for this great opportunity! Camden County College works in partnership with WTHS and provides this opportunity free of cost. Students and parents are encouraged to contact WTHS Guidance Department if interested in this opportunity.

WTHS Marching Band continues to deliver stellar performances in school, community and at competitions. On September 28<sup>th</sup>, at the first competition for the year, the WTHS Band placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in its group and 3<sup>rd</sup> overall with an amazing score of 74.5. Soon followed the championships at Miller University, PA which resulted in the highest score of the season- 85.1! The WTHS Color Guard Team also placed 2<sup>nd</sup> among those in its division. This year's show, performed at Eagle's home games during halfitime and in the community, was titled "Shades of Latin." While the band played the four songs in the collection, "El Cumbanchero," "Evil Ways," "Novus," and "Calle Ocho," the color guard added visual spice with their accompanying performance. Director, David Parkhurst, credits the success of the band to all its members. In particular, he recognized the soloists, Ian Kochy, Jahson Saunders, Joshua Whiting and Aaron Ray and leaders of the band, Cidae'a Woods, Derrell Carolina, Antoinette Jackson, Joshua Whiting, Emmalee Ledford and Ciara Johnson.

The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) test was administered on January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2014. This test allows 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students to explore occupations in line with their interests and skill sets. It helps them learn more about themselves and the world of work and to develop effective strategies to reach career goals. The test results are used for career planning and not released to the military. A parent/guardian must submit a written request to one of the guidance counselors in order to release any student's scores to the military. The WTHS Drama Club and Stage Crew will present the classic award-winning musical WEST SIDE STORY on March 13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>, 2014. Students auditioned in December, and the play is cast and moving forward to rehearsals in January. The classic romantic tragedy is based on *Romeo and Juliet*, but in WEST SIDE STORY, the feuding families become two warring New York City gangs in the 1950s, the Jets led by Riff and the Sharks led by Bernardo. Their hatred escalates to a point where neither can coexist with any form of understanding. But when

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Riff's best friend (and former Jet) Tony, and Bernardo's younger sister, Maria, meet at a dance, no one can do anything to stop their love. Maria and Tony begin meeting in secret and planning to run away. The Sharks and Jets plan a rumble under the highway and things go terribly wrong. Seniors Amy Boehly and Michael McGuckin play Maria and Tony, respectively. Andrew Nduati, a senior, is Riff. In addition, Desztiny Soto portrays Anita, Bernardo's girlfriend; Joon Kim, is Lieutenant Schrank and Greg Munford, senior, is Officer Krupke; in addition, an extremely talented cast of high school and middle school actors, dancers, and singers will help bring the powerful emotions of this classic story to stage.

The WTHS football team has many players who received notable recognition in 2013. Special honors were awarded to the following students on specific dates: Jymir Holmes - Touchdown Club Back of the week on September 20<sup>th</sup>, Devon Brown - Touchdown Club Lineman of the week on October 5<sup>th</sup>, Emanuel Mitchell - Brookes Irvine Scholar Athlete on November 4<sup>th</sup> and Michael Rosia - Brookes Irvine Unsung Hero on November 4<sup>th</sup>. Special recognition is also due to the young men who made the All-conference Team for the National Division: Devon Brown, Emmanuel Mitchell, Jymir Holmes, Michael Rosia, Zan Chancy, Devon Jones and Judlin Pierre. Head Football Coach, Mr. Russ Angerstein, and the entire WTHS family salute the hard-earned accomplishments of the team.

Selected juniors and seniors have the opportunity to attend the Shadow Program, a singular opportunity offered by Rowan University School of Osteopathic Medicine. The program was established to give high school students a taste of a day in the life of a medical student. Students were nominated by their school counselor or teachers based on demonstrated interest in pursuing a healthcare profession and possession of a strong academic history. Students were further screened through short essays expressing their chosen medical field and pursuits thus far. Selected students will participate in a lecture, experience a cadaver lab and shadow a medical student: the shadowing will give WTHS students the opportunity to interact and ask questions about careers and clarify expectations in the medical field. It will also expose students to the rigor of medical school and give them the opportunity to plan the steps to achieve their dream career.
