December 13th we honored our November Terrific Kids each student received a certificate and T-Shirt.

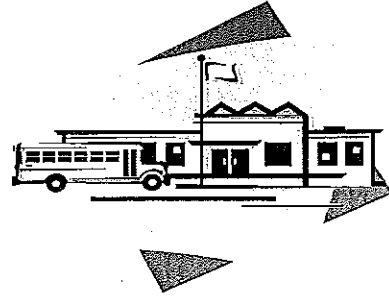
December 16th our November Students of the Month were honored each student received a certificate and a T-Shirt.

- School 6 participated in the South Jersey Food bank rally.

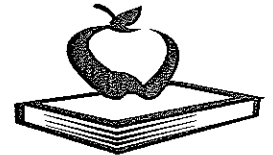
MIDDLE SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS

Last year, she represented WTHS in the All South Jersey Region III Symphonic Band as a Piccolo player. Furthermore, Catherine participated in the Olympic Conference Honors Bands in 2012 and 2013 as a flute player and is currently a member of the Philadelphia Sinfonia, an independent educational Orchestra that performs at a very high level. Catherine is a true inspiration to her peers and mentors in the Winslow Township High School Concert Band and the WTHS family. Way to go Catherine!

Congratulations Chelsea Zackey, WTHS junior, for being selected to receive the Widener University High School Leadership Award. This awards program is designed to recognize high school students in the region who embody the university's commitment to develop and inspire leaders to affect positive change. The letter of notification sent to her read "The award signifies Widener University High School Leadership Awards Committee recognizes your ability to demonstrate courage by standing up for what is right, finding a way to address a wrong, or making a difference in a significant way." Chelsea is a daily testament to the recognition as an exemplary student, president of Key Club- a service organization, stunning actress and member of the Drama Club, historian in student government, newly elected member of The National Honor Society, vital member of the WTHS Community Outreach Team and forerunner of the upcoming student-forum on January 9th. Chelsea will be recognized at the National Constitution Center on March 20th, 2014. All award recipients will then convene at Widener's campus for an exciting, unique day of leadership training in the fall of 2014. Additionally, if Chelsea chooses to enroll at Widener upon graduation, she will receive a \$20,000 scholarship.

The annual College for a Day Trip to Camden County College will take place on January 16th, 2014. The purpose of this trip is to assist current high school seniors who plan to attend CCC in the fall. Students will complete the college application, take the placement test and tour the campus in one day! Camden County College admission counselors will return to Winslow Township High School in the spring and students will be able to register for fall classes and receive assistance with the financial aid process. A total of 80 seniors have already registered for this great opportunity! Camden County College works in partnership with WTHS and provides this opportunity free of cost. Students and parents are encouraged to contact WTHS Guidance Department if interested in this opportunity.

WTHS Marching Band continues to deliver stellar performances in school, community and at competitions. On September 28th, at the first competition for the year, the WTHS Band placed 2nd in its group and 3rd overall with an amazing score of 74.5. Soon followed the championships at Miller University, PA which resulted in the highest score of the season- 85.1! The WTHS Color Guard Team also placed 2nd among those in its division. This year's show, performed at Eagle's home games during halftime and in the community, was titled "Shades of Latin." While the band played the four songs in the collection, "El Cumbanchero," "Evil Ways," "Novus," and "Calle Ocho," the color guard added visual spice with their accompanying performance. Director, David Parkhurst, credits the success of the band to all its members. In particular, he recognized the soloists, Ian Kochy, Jahson Saunders, Joshua Whiting and Aaron Ray and leaders of the band, Cidae'a Woods, Derrell Carolina, Antoinette Jackson, Joshua Whiting, Emmalee Ledford and Ciara Johnson.

The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) test was administered on January 8th, 2014. This test allows 10th, 11th and 12th grade students to explore occupations in line with their interests and skill sets. It helps them learn more about themselves and the world of work and to develop effective strategies to reach career goals. The test results are used for career planning and not released to the military. A parent/guardian must submit a written request to one of the guidance counselors in order to release any student's scores to the military. Please contact the WTHS guidance office for any questions, concerns or assistance.

The WTHS Drama Club and Stage Crew will present the classic award-winning musical *WEST SIDE STORY* on March 13th, 14th and 15th, 2014. Students auditioned in December, and the play is cast and moving forward to rehearsals in January. The classic romantic tragedy is based on *Romeo and Juliet*, but in *WEST SIDE STORY*, the feuding families become two warring New York City gangs in the 1950s, the Jets led by Riff and the Sharks led by Bernardo.
