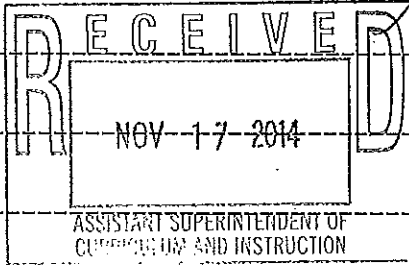

The Key Club would like to place a container in the high school cafeteria to collect these tabs during all lunch periods. When the container becomes full, the Key Club will send the tabs to the Ronald McDonald House of Southern New Jersey.

The following description of this service project comes from the official website of the Ronald McDonald House of Southern New Jersey:

"Pop tabs support the operations of Ronald McDonald Houses across the country. We receive between 35¢ and 70¢ per pound based on the market price of aluminum. There are approximately 763 tabs per pound. The tab of a beverage can is pure aluminum, unlike the rest of the can which contains an alloy of metals and paint. Recycling the tabs helps pay for house operations. Pop tabs are small and convenient to collect. Millions of pop tabs have been collected to benefit Ronald McDonald Houses. You, your group or school can collect tabs as a community service project to help raise money for Ronald McDonald House."

This service project does not solicit any money from students or staff, but instead asks that they remove the tabs from their cans before recycling. This simple project shows students that one person's small effort can make a very large impact when combined with the collective group.

School Violence Awareness Week...

October 20-24, 2014, was School Violence Awareness Week. School #4 counselor, Mrs. Duca, visited all classrooms to talk about bullying, harassment, and intimidation. She emphasized the role that students play in making our school a safe place to be.

Week of Respect

October 6-10, 2014, was the Annual Week of Respect. The school counselor, Mrs. Duca, spent the week delivering individual class lessons throughout the school to increase student awareness. Each classroom was read a book that ties into the theme of Respect.

Pre-K/Kindergarten - It's Okay to Be Different - The theme of this lesson was to be kind to each other despite any differences/disabilities. After reading the story together, the children discussed what makes them special. They then drew a self portrait, emphasizing all of their unique traits.

1<sup>st</sup> Grade - The Crayon Box that Talked - The students in first grade were introduced to this story through a hands-on drawing activity. They first drew a picture using only one color, and then were able to draw a picture with any color they wanted. Then, after watching a short video of the story, they were able to compare their drawings. The students realized that they liked the picture better that was more colorful. The message of this lesson was that, just like the crayons in the story, we create a much better picture when we work together as a team.

2<sup>nd</sup> Grade - Do Unto Otters - Second graders were reintroduced to the idea of "The Golden Rule". They read the book and then went over the different positives behaviors that they would like to receive and display towards others. These were such things as: kindness, cooperation, forgiveness, etc.

3<sup>rd</sup> Grade - Human Kindness - The third graders watched a video about Random Acts of Kindness. They also discussed the people in the video and what they did that was kind. They also talked about how these acts were completed regardless of the differences of the people in the video. They then set a "kindness goal" for themselves for this year and wrote it on an index card. These goals will be reviewed at the end of the year to see if they have reached their goal.

### Red Ribbon Week...

School #4 students participated in Red Ribbon Week during October 23-31, 2014. Our school focus was on violence prevention awareness and promoting positive character. The students were encouraged to participate in themed days during the week to reinforce the message.

The themes were as follows:

**Monday, October 27<sup>th</sup> - Team up against bullying!** Students wore their favorite sports team shirt. Proper uniform pants/skirts were still worn.

**Tuesday, October 28<sup>th</sup> - Put a cap on bullying. Crazy/Favorite Hat Day.**

**Wednesday, October 29<sup>th</sup> - Bullying is hair raising! Crazy Hair Day.**

**Thursday, October 30<sup>th</sup> - Put your best foot forward! Crazy Sock Day.**

**Friday, October 31<sup>st</sup> - Be an upstander, not a bystander! Words are knowledge.** Students will be wearing their Vocabulary Parade costume.

### Home and School Association...

The HSA also funded a Preschool trip to Duffield's on October 17, 2014. Students and their parents had the opportunity to ride to the farm on the bus to learn about fall and to pick pumpkins to celebrate the season with cider and donuts.

### Harvest Celebration...

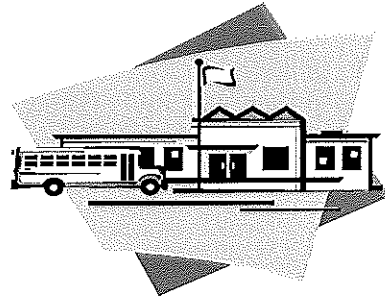

  - The HSA also sponsored a Savaround Coupon Book sale from October 20<sup>th</sup> -31<sup>st</sup>.

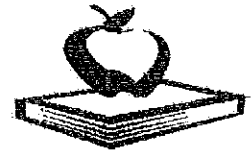

She defines it as "a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses that infect the nose, throat, and lungs. It can cause mild to severe illness." As such, she recommends getting a flu vaccine every year as the best practice for prevention. Symptoms of flu include some or all of the following: fever or feeling feverish/chills, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle or body aches, headaches and vomiting and diarrhea, especially in children. Mrs. Taylor warns that not everyone with the flu will have a fever. Since flu viruses are spread via coming into contact with droplets made when people with flu cough, sneeze or talk, it is important to stay away from sick people, stay home if sick, wipe down surfaces with Clorox, refrain from touching own mouth, eyes or nose without washing hands and wash hands thoroughly. Students and adults can be contagious from day one and up to five to seven days after symptoms subside. Thus, it is integral to stay home from school twenty-four hours after being fever free. Good nutrition, sleep, exercise and proper hydration are the key elements to a speedy recovery.
