"LEARNING GIVES YOU SUPER POWERS!"

Jan. 9th-13th - The Great Kindness Challenge-Kindness Tunnel Kickoff!-Winslow Township Police Officers, Fire Fighters, and Emergency Medical Team Workers greeted students as they arrived at school.

Jan. 13th-Great Kindness Challenge Assembly-Winslow Township Honorable Mayor Wright presented School One with a Kindness Proclamation. Teachers and staff earning Kindness Challenge awards were also recognized during the assembly.

Guest Readers-Police Officers, Fire Fighters, EMT workers, Township committee members, parents and family members read to students in preschool through third grades as part of the Great Kindness Challenge week.

Jan. 6th-Standard Solutions training-Embedded math training in all third grade classrooms.

Jan. 6th-NJ Sustainable Schools- Principal meeting with NJ Sustainable Schools state representative.

Jan. 18th-Faculty meeting-Grade level team meetings used to review and analyze student data.

During the month of January:

Great Kindness Challenge Week - Friendship & Kindness classroom lessons provided by the School Counselor. Events appeared in both the South Jersey Times and Courier Post.

A is for Applebee's- continue to recognize students in partnership with local Applebee's restaurant sponsorship of an academic program providing incentives for students to achieve academic excellence and/or effort, rewarding certificates for meals and various food items.

RTI-Response to Intervention-students receive daily RTI instruction in first through third grades, at their specific learning level from low struggling to advanced learners as part of the instructional day.

Word of the Day-third grade students announce higher level vocabulary writing and math words and phrases as part of the morning daily announcements. The words of the day and students names are displayed in the front foyer of the school building.

I&RS-Intervention and Referral Services-I&RS meetings used to discuss and review student data and performance of students struggling behaviorally or academically.

Emergency /Safety Drills-regularly scheduled monthly emergency/safety drills conducted across the District to ensure the safety of all staff and students in the event of an actual emergency.

Parent/Principal meetings-Parent/Teacher/Principal meetings-meetings to discuss student discipline, classroom concerns, peer issues or conflicts, instructional needs and student data.

Principal's Meetings-Principal's attendance at regularly scheduled Principals meetings.

Meetings with District ELA and Math Supervisors to determine the instructional needs of students in preschool through third grades, curriculum and instruction common core alignment and third grade student PARCC preparation.

Regular HSA meetings-monthly Home and School Association meetings to support communication between home, school and community, plan events and discuss upcoming School One activities.

Student data assessments - Continue to oversee and coordinate scheduling and administering of required district benchmarks, specific to the district assessment period in preschool-third grade.

Grade level team meetings-building principal meetings with preschool through third grade level teams and team leaders-discuss and review student data, grade level trends, grade level collaboration, parent/teacher communication and teacher recommendations, specific to each grade level to determine the most effective instructional strategies for struggling learners, average students and advanced students.

Writing and math "Word of the Day" presented by third grade students during daily morning announcements. Preschool through third grade teachers write "Word of the Day" and challenge students with the word throughout the instructional day.

Common Core (PARCC) Vocabulary Words/Terms-provided for every teacher to incorporate into daily instruction in preschool through third grades.

The Master Teacher pamphlet-the Master Teacher Program is a seven week program providing practical ideas and suggestions for educators. Each pamphlet features specific and current information for teachers in the areas of; teaching strategies, discipline student motivation assessment, the common core standards, communication skills and professionalism.

Principal meetings with Leadership Team, Reading Specialist and CST case manager, and I&RS coordinator to ensure the most effective use of student data, student placement and instructional resources and strategies.

Superhero Awards, Super Citizen Awards, Super Class Awards-School One Superhero theme promotes and recognizes character, positive behaviors, leadership, respect and effort.

Superhero Awards-students names are randomly selected from a Superhero Box with Superhero tickets earned from School One staff for demonstrating leadership and good citizenship throughout the school day. Twenty five students are selected each week to have their picture taken and receive an award from the Principal.

Perfecting Chords- Perfecting Church-Perfecting Chords Music Program-Perfecting Church's Perfecting Chords members provide a musical/instrumental afterschool program for School One students on site every Monday.

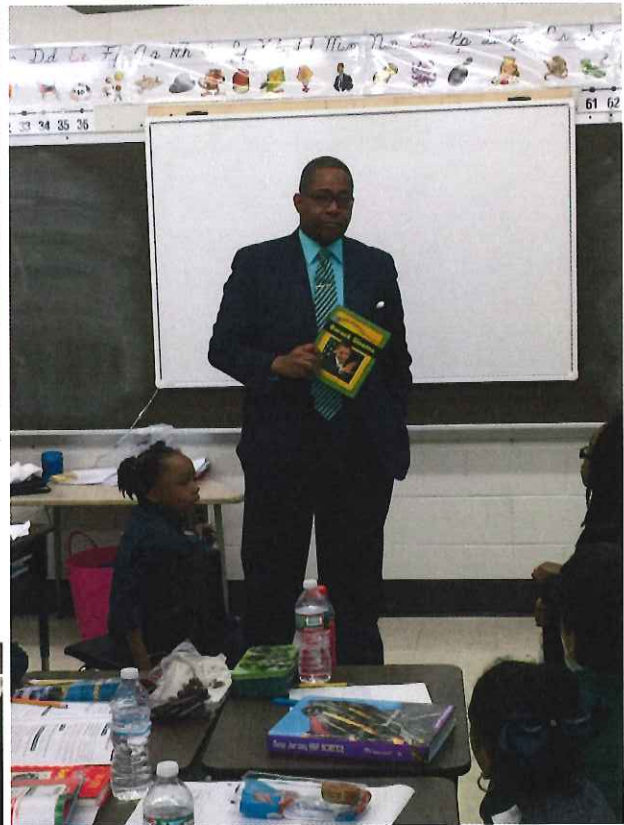

No Name Calling Week

The week of January 16-20 was School #4's Fourth Annual No Name Calling Week. Our school counselor, Mrs. Laura Duca, conducted classroom lessons for each class by reading the books listed below. A short lesson was done in the beginning, followed by a brief discussion. Each class then completed an appropriate theme-related activity. The lessons/activities were as follows:

- **Pre-School**- We read "The Peace Book" by Todd Parr. This book discusses what peace looks like, sounds like, feels like and even tastes like. - **Kindergarten** - We will read, "I'm Gonna Like Me" by Jamie Lee Curtis. This book discusses having confidence in yourself and all of your unique abilities talents. The children wrote down what they liked best about themselves on an award ribbon, which served as their own "Character Trophy".
- **1st Grade** - We read the book "Chrysanthemum" by Kevin Henkes. This is a book about being proud of who you are and confident in your own unique personality. Since a chrysanthemum is a flower, the students then built their own kindness garden. They decorated the petals of a flower with kind words or actions and color it in. The flowers were displayed together.
- **2nd Grade** - Second grade listened to "My Secret Bully" by Trudy Ludwig. The book talks about how a girl is bullied secretly by someone who everyone else thinks is her friend. We discussed how we could help ourselves or someone else who may be in that same situation. They then wrote kind words on their own "Shield of Kindness". These were words they used to project positivity and to protect them from unkind words.
- **3rd Grade** - Third grade compared the message from a song called "Together we can Change the World" and a video called "The Kindness Boomerang" (which features a song called "One Day" by Matisyahu). They received the lyrics to both songs and had an open discussion about what the lyrics meant to them. Both songs discussed kindness and how a small act of kindness can affect global change. The kids then decorated their own person and described what small acts of kindness they can do daily to set off that ripple effect of positive change.

- The 4th Grade classes went to Adventure Aquarium on January 27, 2017 for their class trip.

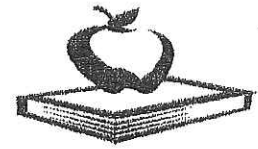

Nurse's Corner-MLK Spotlight-Henrietta Lacks – was an impoverished black woman who died at the young age of 31 on Oct. 4th, 1951. During her treatment of cervical cancer, a doctor took a sample of her tumor and sent it over to a colleague of his who had been trying for two decades to grow human tissue from cultures with no success. Henrietta's cells were unique because they could live and replicate outside of the human body. Soon doctors realized that as long as the cells received the proper nutrients needed to survive, they could be shipped across countries, frozen for decades and thawed, etc., and they would continue to replicate. Her cells became the first human immortal cells ever grown in a lab. This unprecedented scientific discovery led to finding treatments for many diseases, including polio, cancer, leukemia, influenza, Parkinson's, AIDS, etc. They also aided in the discovery of how cells work, in-vitro fertilization, gene mapping and more. Her cells were even sent into space on an unmanned satellite to determine whether humans can survive in zero gravity. Henrietta died of uremic poisoning in a segregated ward about eight months after being diagnosed with cancer. It is noted that she never knew her cells were taken and used as the "most vital tools in modern medicine which would spawn a multi-billion dollar industry." She is survived by a husband and three children, who didn't know her cells were being used until 25 years later. So, in honor of Black History Month, we salute Henrietta Lacks, whose unique cells contributed to many breakthroughs in modern medicine.
