Dr. Poteat reported that the parents of a student who was removed from the school district has requested to use our textbooks. We may not get the textbooks back. Parents have previously paid for books up front. We are beginning to receive more types of requests for textbooks for children being home schooled.

Ms. Pitts asked if we should treat it individually or is a policy needed. We would need a first and second reading for a policy to be adopted. Do they need the books immediately?

Dr. Poteat responded that yes, the child is now at home. It is difficult to collect the books or the monies for the books. If there is no policy it is up to the Superintendent.

Mr. Benjamin, Sr., commented that a decision is needed in this case because it is an emergency.

Dr. Poteat said that we can ask for a deposit from the parents for the cost of the books.

Mrs. Yanez stated that the Board of Education deals with parents, their children and their money. She would not oppose a parent to educate their child in any way they want but our primary obligation is to the students who remain in the district. She cannot support the textbooks leaving the district for a child who leaves the district.

Mrs. Sturdivant asked about a policy for lost textbooks.

Dr. Poteat stated that each book is identified to a student – very seldom does the parent pay for a lost book. Upon graduation if they have lost or destroyed property that is the only recourse we have. Parents do not feel that they have to replace the textbooks.

Ms. Pitts stated that with regard to the emergency situation she would be in favor of allowing the parents to pay for the books and refund 90% of the cost upon their return. The child is still a member of this community.

A motion was made by Mr. Benjamin, Sr., seconded by Ms. Pitts, to allow the parents the use of the textbooks. The parents would pay 100% of the cost of the textbooks and be refunded 90% upon their return.
