Dr. Garcia reported that she has received inquiries and that repairs are being made at the bus garage. Buses and equipment were sold for \$5,617.00 and books were sold for \$1,642.00.

## XVI. NEW BUSINESS (Discussion Items)

Ms. Peterson reported that two students from the High School received athletic Letters of Intent. William Belton for football to Penn State and Rob Mahon for football to Old Dominion.

Dr. Poteat also commented that these students and their parents are to be commended for their academics as well their athletic accomplishments. Importance is often place on athletics but you have to be academically eligible by the NCAA as well. Joe Paterno does not recruit any student, Mr. Belton is someone you can be proud of. The District will honor the seniors.

Ms. Yanez reported that on Saturday, January 29, 2011 Ms. Pitts, Ms. Peterson, Mr. Sturdivant and herself attended training entitled "Collaborating on Real Solutions to the 2% Cap". It was held at the War Memorial Building in Trenton, NJ. The program was sponsored by the NJSBA and NJ State League of Municipalities and ran from 9:15 a.m. – 3:15 p.m. Those in attendance were school board officials and municipal township officials. The following was discussed:

- The 2% Cap is a hard/strict cap with very few exemptions that would allow the Board to make adjustments above the cap.
- The 2% property tax levy cap will present vast challenges for the 2011-2012 budget year.
- They encouraged collaboration between the school board and municipal governing bodies because we face challenging times ahead and both governing bodies work for the same group of taxpayers or constituents.
- We must ask the question: Are we working together for the benefit of the residents we are supposed to be servicing.
- Everyone must understand that the schools need to be supported because people and businesses will move in or out of your town based on your school district.
- Spoke extensively about the recession and economic outlook.
- We are in a deep economic and employment hole that will take many years to recover from.
- To return to the 5% unemployment rate prior to the recession we would have to make up an employment deficit of 11.1 million jobs and that will take 8.5 years or until the summer of 2018.
- Spoke about negotiations and that 80% of school district budget is a fixed cost. Salary and benefits taking up most of that.
- School Boards have one pot of money. Salary and benefits all must come out of that pot contained within the 2% Cap.
- It is unlikely there will be any additional aid to school districts this year.
- They discussed shared services and gave an example of success stories and used Woodbridge Township as an example:

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- The district uses the township's grant writers.
- When the township installed GPS systems in all police cars they put GPS systems in all school buses as well.
- The Township sets up all school district computer systems and provides training on those systems.
- The township allows the school district hockey teams to use the township community center.
- The Township is looking at using the school district carpenter, plumbers and electricians to save cost.

They encourage Boards and municipal officials to focus on the depth of the level of cooperation and collaboration and remove the focus from competition and people's political future and leave all egos at the door.
